When the Article is accepted, we undertake to publish it as soon as we reasonably can. On publication, we will send you a free digital copy. We will take all reasonable steps to maximise the visibility of the Journal, and of your Article within it.
- V. Copyright remains yours, and we will acknowledge this in the copyright line which appears on your Article. However, you authorise us to act on your behalf to defend your copyright if anyone should infringe it, and to retain half of any damages awarded, after deducting our costs.
