

What to expect when publishing Open Access via a Publish and Read agreement

Our aim is to make the process of publishing your article Open Access as easy as possible and to this we have partnered with Copyright Clearance Center.

Below is a visualization of the process and requirements from submission through to publication. If the information provided during submission is complete and accurate, authors will not need to do anything more after this point – everything is automated.

Submission


- Corresponding author provides their Publish and Read eligibility:
- Affiliation and institutional email in the peer review system
- Affiliation and institutional email in manuscript
- •Select 'Yes' to the 'Do you wish to publish Open Access?' question
- Click 'View Publication Charges' to confirm eligibility

Acceptance

- Upon acceptance of the manuscript for publication, the corresponding author receives an email with a link to request funding from their institution, with touch-free profiles the request is sent to the institution automatically.
- •The library admin will then receive an email request to approve funding under the deal.
- •Approval by the institution may be given automatically if the profile is set to 'auto approval'.

Production and publication

- •Corresponding author receives an email confirming their article is covered for Open Access publication by the Publish and Read deal
- •The corresponding author's institution is acknowledged on the bottom of the first page of the published paper: 'This article was made open access via a Publish and Read agreement between the Microbiology Society and the corresponding author's institution'



With touch-free profiles a funding request will automatically sent to the Authors' institution upon acceptance of the manuscript. Institutional approval may be given automatically if the profile is set to auto-approval.

The Author will then receive email confirmation that their article is covered for fee-free Open Access publication.
